Diego Ferrari is an artist and photographer with over 21 years' experience in exhibitions, residencies and lecturing on his projects around the world. His recent work takes a fine art approach to street photography. His practice interrogates the relationship between social values and public spaces, with a particular interest in the relationship between the body and its environment, articulating modes of individual and collective experiences and social relations.

Ferrari teaches on the Masters course in Photography and Design at Elisava Barcelona School of Design & amp; Engineering and is a Senior lecturer on the BA in Photography at Kingston University London; he also contributes as a lecturer on the MA in Photography and Urban Cultures at Goldsmiths, University of London. In 2012 Ferrari became a Co-programmer on the annual Urban Encounters symposium at Tate Britain in partnership with the Centre of Urban and Community Research (CUCR), Goldsmiths University of London and Kingston University.
